The International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) is a challenging and engaging five-year programme of study for students aged 11-16. 

- Reading: Students' ability to understand and interpret written texts.
- Writing: Students' ability to write clear, coherent, and grammatically correct texts.
- Speaking: Students' ability to communicate effectively in spoken form.
- Listening: Students' ability to understand and interpret spoken texts.
- Knowledge and understanding: Students' knowledge of the key concepts of the course and their understanding of how these concepts are applied in different contexts.

- Differentiated instruction: Teachers provide differentiated instruction to meet the needs of all students, and ensure that all students are able to access the learning content.



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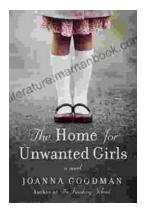
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
