The organization was founded in 2013 by four women engineers and educators who were concerned about the lack of female representation in STEM. Programs and Initiatives

technology. * Many See Her Turn It Up alumnae have gone on to pursue careers in engineering and technology.

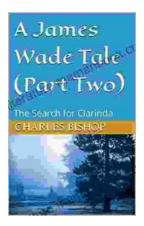

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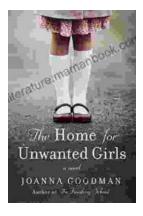
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
